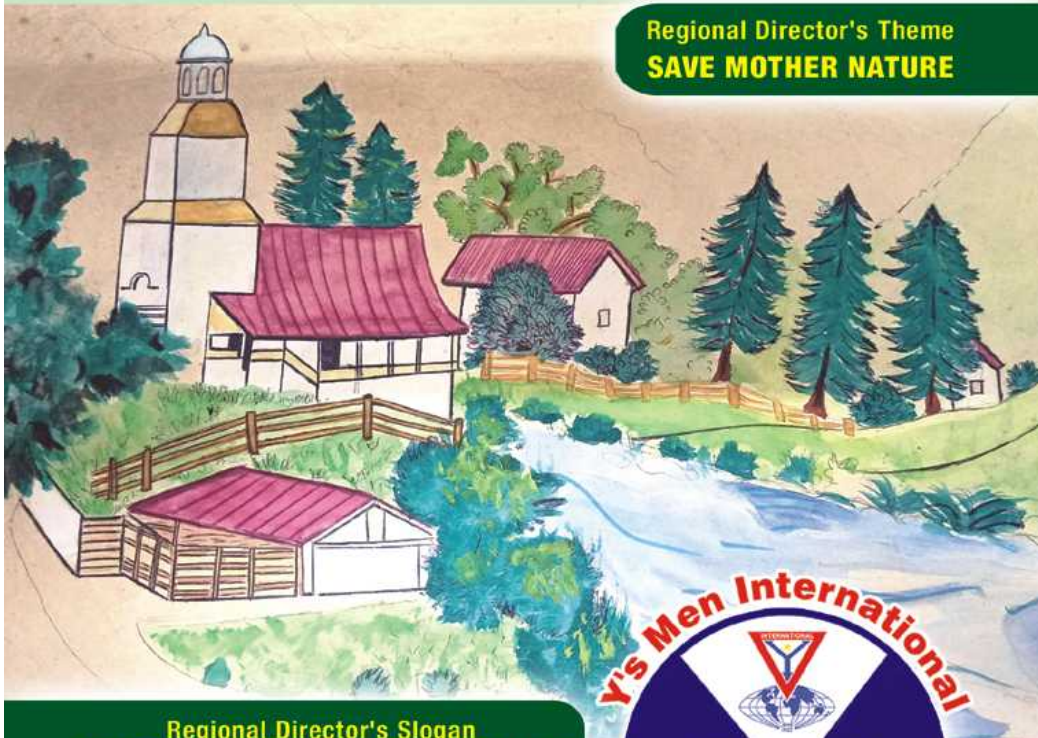

Y's DOM AT A GLANCE

Founded in Toledo, Ohio, USA in 1922 to support a local YMCA, Y's Men International is now oriented for serving the worldwide YMCA, the largest non-governmental youth organisation, and through it the communities in which it is present throughout the world. Since the YMCA is usually known as "the Y" in the USA, and as the Y's Men movement started there as a club of "men of and for the Y", it was named the "Y's Men's Club".

Judge Paul William Alexander was the founder of the first club together with a group of young men.

However, today women also can be full members of our movement (and indeed many women are among its members and family participation is encouraged in numerous activities). This is a very important selling point in many communities. Since 1995 local affiliated clubs wishing to emphasize this openness can choose to call themselves "Y's Men and Women's Clubs" or "Y's Service Clubs". Members are known as Y's Men or Y's Women.

MOTTO

"To acknowledge the duty that accompanies every right".

This motto was adopted by Y's Men because of the tendency of most people to insist upon full enjoyment of all rights while remaining oblivious to the corresponding duties giving validity to such rights.

The motto is a constant challenge to us to pay less heed to our rights, and more to the discovery and discharge of our corresponding duties - to transfer the emphasis from rights to duties.

The star symbolises the Star of Bethlehem. Just as that star served as a guide to the wise Men of the East, so shall this golden star, which also represents the ideals of our club, serve as a constant guide to the Y's Men of today and lead them to a true realisation of the nobility of unselfish service.

INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS AND PROGRAMME

Our international organisation promotes and co-ordinates many programmes intended to provide service and assist in the solution of problem that are beyond the capability of an individual club. An additional purpose is to promote the international aspect of our organisation. To be really meaningful, these programmes should be adopted by each club. In reality, not all clubs can be actively participation to some degree is not only possible but will be or real benefit to your club.

ALEXANDER SCHOLARSHIP FUND (ASF)

This fund is named after our Founder, Judge Paul William Alexander and has as its purpose to help young people become YMCA staff members. In some cases, it also provides funding for further training of those who have already started a career in the YMCA. At the 1950 Mexico City Convention of Y's Men International, it was proposed that the Founder President Paul William Alexander be honoured by having his portrait painted. But, Alexander was not in favour of spending a huge amount for this purpose and he suggested that the money be utilized for a noble cause. Consequently, instead of the portrait, a photograph was taken and the balance money was utilized for creating a trust for imparting training to YMCA Secretaries. This fund was originally known as PWAS Fund or Paul William Alexander Scholarship Fund.

Some Regions collect a fixed amount per member along with Regional dues; other Regions collect the funds through voluntary contribution of members. Each Area is expected to administer its own AS Fund. 10% of the ASF money collected in each Area should be set aside and sent to International for an International training Programme, selected in co-operation with the World Alliance of YMCAs. The balance 90% could be utilized by the Area for the training of the Regional Service Directors.

BROTHERHOOD FUND (BF)

The Brotherhood Fund promotes world fellowship among the clubs, among members of clubs and with the YMCAs through out the world, through financial grants for International visitations by 'Brotherhood Fund Delegates'.

The Brotherhood Fund was started in 1931 and it was known as 'Bishops Fund' till 1968. Those days, the Churches had certain funds to enable their bishops to travel and that was how the name 'Bishops Fund' was given to this too. This fund is meant to meet fully or partly the travel costs of Y's Men delegates traveling to other countries for attending international conventions or making Club visitations to promote world fellowship between the clubs and members. From 1968, this fund is known as Brotherhood Fund (BF). This very name is given to emphasize the importance of Brotherhood in Y's dom.

The BF means a lot for Y's Men International in broadening the knowledge of Y's Men's work in other countries and increasing the understanding between people from different countries. Not only the BF delegates benefit in this way, but also the clubs, which receive the BF delegates as guests in their homes and at their club meetings.

There are specific guidelines for a Y's Man to qualify himself for selection as a BF delegate. He must be a potential leader, who has to act as an ambassador of Y's dom, 'capable of benefitting from his trip for the promotion of Y'sdom and also must be in a position to impart knowledge to the clubs and members whom he meets.

The Brotherhood Fund is raised from contributions from Clubs and from the sale of cancelled Postage stamps and First Day Covers; and also from cash contributions. As regards stamps, Commemorative stamps are usually preferred because they will fetch better price in the market. Each stamp is to be very well cleaned and must be completely free from dust or gum. The most important thing is that the edges must be intact. Otherwise it will not fetch the price it deserves.

Important information to all applicants for BF grants :

Alf Reynolds Award If your club did not receive the 'ALF Reynolds Award' previous year (by contributing CHF 5 per member as per October report), your application will normally be not considered during the current year by the Brotherhood Fund Expenditure Committee.

However, the BHF Expenditure Committee is authorized to waive this criteria if other factors are deemed to be of greater importance'. Such factors may be: a) The club is a new one. b) The club is in a country, where it is prohibited to send money and /or stamps out of the country. If your club has not met the BF point criteria, you should send a letter together with the application, stating the reasons.

B.F. Grant Limits ABF Grant is limited to:

- a) International travel cost based on Apex or other round trip Air fare.
- b) Premium of ordinary travel insurance. - NB: Ys Men International pays for the cost of the insurance, but it is the responsibility of the BF delegate to take out such insurance.
- c) Other necessary expenses approved in advance by BFECC (Brotherhood Fund Expenditure Committee Chairman)
Planning of Travel will be planned by the travel coordinator according to the BF delegate plan.

NB: The BF delegate shall make all necessary arrangements concerning visas before leaving the home country. Y's Men International will provide official invitation letters as requested by the BF delegate. A BF delegate shall follow the itinerary as presented by the Travel Co-ordinators and must be willing to travel for at least three weeks (see Form BF2 Line SA), at the time as indicated in the BF Delegate Plan.

Where to send the BF application form

BF application forms are sent to RD every year. The BF Application Form is to be filled in by the applicant in triplicate, who shall:

- ◆ Send one copy to the Regional Director

- ◆ Send one copy to the Area President
- ◆ Send one copy directly to BFEC as indicated on the Form BF2

The applicant should submit the application to the Regional Director and he forwards the application with recommendation to reach the Area President positively before 15th November or any date fixed by BFEC from time to time. The BFEC takes its final decision on the recommendation of the Area President. There are two types of Grants — Partial and Full. Partial Grants cover part of the expenses to attend the International Convention. Full Grant is given for Club visitation in other countries. As a general rule, Y's Men having received a BF Grant is not eligible to receive a second Grant. However after a period of three years someone who had received a Full Grant is eligible for Partial Grant and vice versa.

ENDOWMENT FUND (EF) :

The purposes of the Endowment Fund, created in 1959, is to receive and hold endowment gifts, devices or bequests in the form of cash or other property for the exclusive benefit of Y's Men International to provide financial aid and stability to its present and future purpose, objectives, programme and expansion.

Administration of the Fund shall be by a Board of Trustees consisting of five members selected from the membership of Y's Men's Clubs, each serving alternating terms of five years. One new Trustee shall be appointed each year by the International President with the approval of the international Council.

When a Club or individuals make a contribution to the EF, they have the opportunity for permanently getting recorded the Golden deeds of Y's Men, YMCA executives, other social workers or relatives and friends of Y's dom, in whose name the contribution is made. This Golden Book is permanently displayed at the Y's Men Headquarters in Geneva. Switzerland.



Now, there are many ways of contributing to EF.

- a) Living Tribute Make a gift of CHF 120 or more to EF and give tribute in the name of a person you respect or love, to be inscribed in the Golden Book.
- b) Memorial Tribute make a gift of CHF 120 or more in memory of your beloved deceased relative, friend or any loving and respected person to be inscribed in the Golden Book.
- c) Paul William Alexander Fellow Donate CHF 120 or more in his/her name or in the name of anybody you like. In addition to the inscription in the Golden Book, a Certificate and PWAf lapel pin will be given from IHQ.
- d) Friend of Endowment : With a contribution of CHF 50 or more you become a Friend of Endowment Fund. Your name will be listed in the Endowment Friend Page in the Golden Book.
- e) Member Honour Roll : With a contribution of CHF 1000 or more to the EF, you can become a Member Honour Roll. You can also sponsor any one you like for this prestigious honour by supporting the EF with a donation of CHF 1000 or more. In addition to an enlisting in the special page of the Golden Book, a Crystal Ice Berg Memento with the name written on it will be given to the Honour Roll Member, which could be proudly displayed in home, office or business place. A beautiful Golden Pin also will be given to be worn with pride.
- f) Honour Roll Couple : A couple can be enlisted as Honour Roll Members, if that couple or any body in their name has made a contribution of CHF 1000 or more to this effect. In this case, the Crystal Ice Berg memento will mention the names of both husband and wife. Both of them will be presented with separate Golden Pins to wear.
- g) Honour Roll Club : When a Club or congregation contributes CHF 1000 or more to the EF, the name of the Club or Congregation will be listed on the Honour Roll special page, in the Golden Book. A Crystal Ice Berg Memento inscribed with the

name of the Club / congregation will be given to them ceremoniously.

- h) DPWAF A person may contribute CHF 240 to the endowment fund for a second time will be listed as Double Paul William Alexander Fellow in the Golden Book and a lapel pin will be given from IHQ.

SPECIAL DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT

The interest accrued from the EF every year is now utilized for giving “Special Development Support” to Areas designated for the purpose of expanding and improving Y’s Men International in the following fields (1) Membership expansion (2) Club expansion (3) Leadership Training (4) Any other project approved by Y’s Men International. For the last few years, India Area had received assistance from this fund for starting new clubs in hitherto unexplored areas, especially in North India.

INTERNATIONAL BROTHER CLUBS (IBC) :

In this programme individual clubs establish a close relationship with one or more other clubs in other Regions, usually but not always, in a different country. The first contact may be an Area Convention or International convention or through personal visit of one Y’s man to another Region or Country. The contacts can always be arranged through IBC team, DSD/RSD/ASD/ISD for International Brother Clubs.

When it is established only between two clubs with two way communication, it can be called a two way Brother club programme. This can be extended to another club in another Region/Country, with three way communication between the three clubs. Then it becomes a Brother club triangle.

Contacts between clubs may consist of exchange of letters, Bulletins, slides or audio/video cassette tapes telling about the activities of each club. There may also be an exchange of handicrafts



which can be sold at a club programme featuring the Brother club country, with income going to the (Brotherhood Fund. Clubs in industrialized countries may undertake/support a project together with the Brother Club in a less privileged country. Visits by club members may be arranged.

Further details are available in International Brother Clubs manual leased by International.

TIME OF FAST (TOF) :

Time of Fast is an important project conceived by the Y's men movement in 1972 and continued each year since then. This project, which started in a very small way at the International Convention of 1972, is in keeping with the aims and objectives of our movement. Every year new projects are adopted and goals are fixed for the Time of Fast. Each year the money raised for the projects is utilised on a World Service Programme of the World Alliance of YMCAs. These programme are meant to educate people in underdeveloped regions, to establish YMCAs in developing countries, to train local leadership, and to help refugees.

Every club is encouraged to raise funds for Time of Fast; each member is expected to forgo one meal and contribute the amount to the fund. A specific meeting, **usually during the month of February**, is set as the Time of Fast meeting. Many local clubs forego their dinner or tea during their club meeting in the Time of Fast month in order to raise money for the Fund.

The objects of the Time of Fast project are twofold:

- 1) By practicing the token self-denial, we undergo an experience of suffering a little hunger, symbolic of the hunger suffered daily by millions of undernourished people.
- 2) By contributing to the fund the cost of the meal missed, we support the project financially. In many parts of the world Y's Menettes and Y' slings also take part in this project and contribute the funds they have raised. For promotion of TOF programme, ICM'97



approved 'TOF Club Awards' to be handled by Area and Region. Clubs, with an average contribution per member, equaling the cost of one, two or four meals in that country (as of now, cost of one meal in India Area is considered as CHF 0.60, for this calculation) are eligible for 'Bronze', 'Silver' and 'Gold' Awards respectively. Up to 5% of the TOF money collected can be spent for this.

Time of Fast projects are promoted by an International Service Director appointed by the International President.

The International Council in 1985 decided that the Time of Fast emphasis for the following year should be on "Underprivileged children" and this continued to be the focus of Time of Fast up to 1991.

The theme adopted for TOF projects from 1991 to 1999 was "Community Development and Family Involvement". Out of US \$ 1,520,697 spent on TOF projects' through out the world during this period, money spent on 15 projects in India came to US \$ 1,31,585.

From 1999, the ICM decided to give emphasis on schemes prepared with the objective of "Building People's Futures".

ICM 04 decided that Y's Men International should always have a 'Unified Global Project' under TOF programme.

(The International President has an Emergency Fund of CHF 4000 {increased to CHF 5000 from 2001} and it is also utilised every year for giving emergency relief to people adversely affected by act of God, fire, drought etc.)

India has received substantial support from TOF Fund for various projects. In fact, it is much more than what we raised here towards TOF Fund.

SHORT TERM EXCHANGE PROGRAMME (STEP) :

STEP is an exchange programme for youth whereby they spend 3 - 11 weeks with a Y's Men's family in another country or region of a country. It developed out of a desire for a programme that offered the



opportunity for International experience to those who are unable or do not wish to participate in the longer exchange offered by Youth Educational Exchange Programme (YEPP).

In contrast to YEPP, STEP does not involve attending school in another country. Rather, the focus is on participation in activities of interest for the student and the host family, club and community. Examples include: club fund raising activities, involvement in YMCA camps or Time Of Fast (TOF) projects.

STEP shares many of the objectives as YEPP such as to promote better world understanding among people of different cultures and to provide an international experience to future leaders of Y'sdom. Some of the many benefits of STEP are :

Experiencing different cultures, customs and languages

Experiencing the joys of world brotherhood and peaceful association among nations.

Learning about the activities of Y'sdom world wide Growing in self-confidence, responsibility and maturity. Bringing an international flavour to the host club community.

Learning about one's own country from a different location (if participating in an exchange within the country).

The programme is open to students aged 15-25 years old. Those who apply for this programme should be mature enough to be ambassador for Y'sdom and live away from home for a period of 3-11 weeks.

STEP is a programme with endless possibilities. It is important that clubs promote it so that students are made aware of this fantastic opportunity for international experience and growth. The programme benefits not just the student, but also the host family and community and our entire movement because it helps fulfil one of the ultimate purposes of the Y's Men/YMCA world fellowship. By providing this opportunity to youth, we can ensure that future generations will be involved in and excited about Y's dom. This



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programme will succeed in its aims providing all participants open their minds to new and innovative ideas. It is necessary that the club, host family and student cooperate together to ensure that everyone benefits from the experience. The host family, the loving home environment as well as club members give the applicant as many opportunities as possible to learn about Y'sdom in action.

STEP For All STEP For All is a short-term exchange program that is open to members of all ages of Y'sdom. It offers the opportunity to individual members to participate in a volunteering holiday connected to a Time of Fast Global Project Fund project. The purpose of a STEP For All visit is to participate in a specific active project of the Time of Fast-Global Project Fund, providing support and encouragement to those involved and sharing about the experience upon returning home. The participant is thus effectively an ambassador for the specific project they have visited as well as for the TOF-GPF and STEP For all programs.

Most visit will be two to three (2-3) weeks in duration. Unlike a Brotherhood Fund delegate, the STEP For All participant will bear the full costs of travel, accommodation and meals. There is no requirement for the local Y's Men's /Y Service Club to host, transport, feed or care cater to the STEP For All participant in any manner.

There is the possibility of a partial travel grant through unclaimed Brotherhood Fund grant monies. Should funds be available, a maximum grant would be half of the airfare from the applicant's home to the location of the TOF-GPF project.

YOUTH EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME (YEPP) :

It is the realization of a dream by two Y's Men. George Gustafson, U. S.A. and Ingemar Washitrom, Sweden, back in 1966 when they met at Y International Convention in Hawaii, to organize exchange of youth between Y's Men families from different countries. Such exchanges started through their effort between Scandinavia and North America in 1972/74. In 1974/75 the International President



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Harry G. Cummings, decided to launch this as an International Programme as it was felt:

YEOP opens us exciting opportunities for : People-to-people understanding. Excellent educational benefits Establishing international friendship Learning about a new culture Doing the things you may have only dreamt about Sharing your home and family experience. This is a programme where youth aged 16 to 18 years are given the opportunity to study for one year in a foreign country. The student is hosted by a Y's man family and lives as a member of that family during the year.

This is an exchange programme which is open to host families who will house a student from another country and to families who want to send their youth away for an unforgettable experience.

Y'S EXTENSION SERVICE (YES)

YES To give Clubs and individuals the opportunity to contribute to extension of Y's Men International for immediate use. Funds available from YES are to be used solely for extension as defined hereafter.

Extension in existing clubs to increase member numbers.

Y Extension through new clubs in countries and other geographical areas where Y's Men already are existing.

Extension through new clubs in geographical territories with no Y's Men's Clubs.

ROLL BACK MALARIA

Malaria is a parasitic disease transmitted by the bite of infected mosquitoes. once the first symptoms appear. Malaria can kill very rapidly. In Africa, Malaria is the leading cause of death among young children, killing a child every 30 seconds.

Long-lasting insecticidal mosquito nets (LLINs), if used properly, successfully prevent mosquitoes from infecting people with this disease. Studies show that high level of insecticide-treated net



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coverage can reduce malaria mortality by some 20 percent and malaria incidence by 50 percent in children less than five year of age. When combined with early diagnosis and treatment, use of LLINs can reduce malaria mortality by over 50 percent.

The ROLL BACK MALARIA PROJECT is directly related to achieving the United Nation's Millennium Development Goal 6 (MDG 6) and specifically Target 6C to reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases.

The Objectives :

Y's Men International will collect funds from members to purchase and distribute package containing long-lasting insecticidal mosquito nets (LLINs), insecticide retreatment kits, immunizations, Vitamin A (or multiple micronutrient) supplementation, and anti-malarial "blister packs" for managing fever at home.

Funds will provide training, logistics and support activities but no administrative costs.

The ROLL BACK MALARIA PARTNERSHIP is the global framework for coordinated action against malaria. In 2008, Y's Men International collaborated with the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) to distribute packages in Sierra Leone. The IFRC will continue as a partner and campaign to distribute nets funded by Y's Men International in Sierra Leone, Kenya, Liberia and India. Each Club is expected to set its goal by determining the number of mosquito nets it will donate and pay the cost-of the nets to YMI. Cost of each insecticide treated mosquito net is 616/-



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REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S VISIT TO CLUBS

RD's visit to the club is one of the most important aspects of a Y's Men's Club. It is official and a must for each club.

RD Y'sm. S.V. NAGARAJAN and his team are eager to make use of the visit to clubs in more ways than one :

1. To enjoy the fellowship with club members and to know everyone by name and also personally.
2. Verify the club records and guide the members for improvement of the club.
3. See for himself and appreciate the project & programme of the club.
4. Guide and motivate the club members in all aspects of the club's functioning.
5. Appreciate and Recognize the President, Secretary, Treasurer and outstanding members in the club for the contribution to the movement through their club.

At the same time the club can avail opportunity to :

1. To exchange ideas with the Regional Director & his team and get their doubts on Club/District/Region relating to the movement from him.
2. During the visit the club can plan and execute worthy projects.
3. To enjoy their camaraderie and demonstrate the club's hospitality.
4. To increase the reputation of the club as a part of image building exercise of the Y's Men movement.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR THE RD'S VISIT TO THE CLUB

The Club in S.I. Region are advised to fix the date for the RD's official visit to the club with the Regional Secretary with a copy of RD, as early as possible, giving sufficient time for the Regional team to accept the required date for the visit.



When contacting the Regional Secretary kindly give two or three alternate dates in writing so that any one of the dates can be fixed as per the availability of the RD and also make necessary arrangements to book his/their travel in the case of outstation clubs.

After fixing the date for the RD & his team's visit with the Regional Secretary, get the confirmation in order to avoid any communication gap on both sides.

In the event of a clash on the dates the Regional Director may have to request for a change for an alternate date with the concerned club. In such cases please bear with the change in the date.

Normally weekends will be ideal for the RD's visit especially when the visit to outstation Clubs.

Soon after the confirmation of the date for the visit, inform the RD Elect (If he happens to be in the same place) and the District Governor, DG Elect of the District (only if he is in the same city or town). It is also suggested that LRD & LRD Elect be invited if they are near your place so that they may not Commit for any other meeting on that date. Please make sure the prescribed agenda is followed during the RD's visit.

Twenty minutes before the meeting, the board meeting of the club may be arranged where the inspection of the club materials can be done.

The RD will be the chief guest to the club during his visit. No other guest of honour or special guest or guest speaker shall be invited during his visit.

The RD shall attend the special board meeting of the club prior to the visit which may be held before the regular meeting on the same day. Kindly ensure proper time management.

The RD's visit may be held at the convenient date preferably between 01st September 2020 to 30th April 2021 and in a good venue. It is desirable to have the RD's visit when the club celebrate the Charater-nite as far as possible.

The minute to minute programme and agenda for the special board meeting may be made available in advance.



The meeting time should not exceed 60 minutes and if it is combined with a charter-nite, it should not exceed 90 minutes; similarly, the board meeting should not exceed 15 - 20 minutes.

(Kindly note that the above suggestions are only guidelines to you. However if any change is desired that could be accommodated depending on the situation)

RULES OF PROTOCOL

For the sake of uniformity in recognising various persons in the hierarchy, when they are invited for meetings, it is essential that we are following a definite order, which is normally reflected in 'Protocol'. In the succeeding tabulations, suggested protocols are given for Club, District, Regional and Area meetings. It is highly unlikely that all these officers will attend a meeting together. But every officer right from IP is included in the list only to help organisers to honour the protocol for those officers who attend the meeting. When we invite officers to the dais, limit the number as you wish, but invite them in ascending in order from the bottom of the protocol.

If it is visit of dignitaries like AP, RD, LRD, DG, Outside Guest etc., he/she is invited last to dais to give them more prominence and attention.

When we address them, do it in descending order from the top official for the particular meeting, as per protocol, with Chief Guest addressed next to the presiding officer.

Only the first speaker need address everybody on the dais by name and designation. Rest of the speaker need address only Presiding officer and Chief Guest by name and designation. Others in the meeting may be addressed as a group like 'other leaders on and off the dais, fellow Y's men, Menettes, Lings, Youth and Guests....'

On the dais, Presiding officer will sit in the middle. Dignitaries will be seated on left and right alternatively, in descending order.

Dignitaries will have to be well received at the entrance to the meeting and well attended to till they leave the value.

During officials visit of dignitaries (RD / LRD / DG) do not invite anybody in the rank above the dignitary so that the dignitary is given prominence in the function.

GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING AND CLAIMING OF POINTS

- ❖ Monthly reports should be sent as soft copy / online to the Regional Officers and concerned DG before the due date mentioned in the award criteria or in the reporting forms as supplied to the clubs.
- ❖ Points should be only for activity of a particular calendar month.
Eg : If monthly report is submitted after 10th of the following month, points claimed for that activity will be deducted.
- ❖ Amount spent over and above the minimum amount prescribed for one project will not be eligible for additional points. Eg : If Rs. 30,000/- is spent for one major project of Y's Men, the entitlement is only 750 points.
- ❖ For permanent project, points should be claimed only once.
- ❖ Project undertaken and points already claimed in the previous months reports need not be repeatedly mentioned in the reports for subsequent months. Points should not be repeated.
- ❖ Details of the project should be mentioned in the appropriate column in the reporting form. Points claimed without mention of project details and submission of proof will be deducted. Photos of the projects undertaken, Public Relations and Youth Activities should be attached with the report to claim points.
- ❖ Points for a particular activity should be claimed in the corresponding monthly report. Points claimed at the end of the year for the activities of previous months will not be considered at the end of the year.
- ❖ Points scored and Ranking of Clubs will be circulated periodically to the members through email. Objections and clarification, if any, should be sent to the Regional Secretary within the due date. Objections raised after the due date or at the end of the year will not be entertained.
